

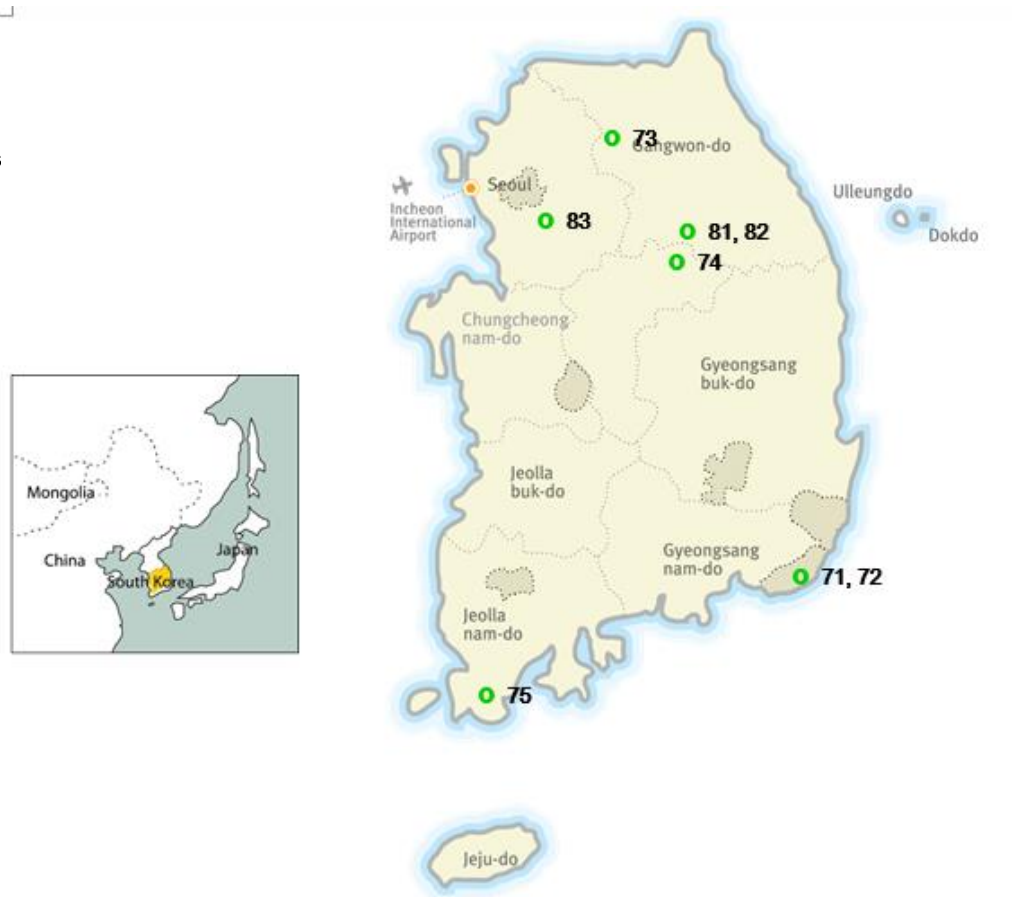

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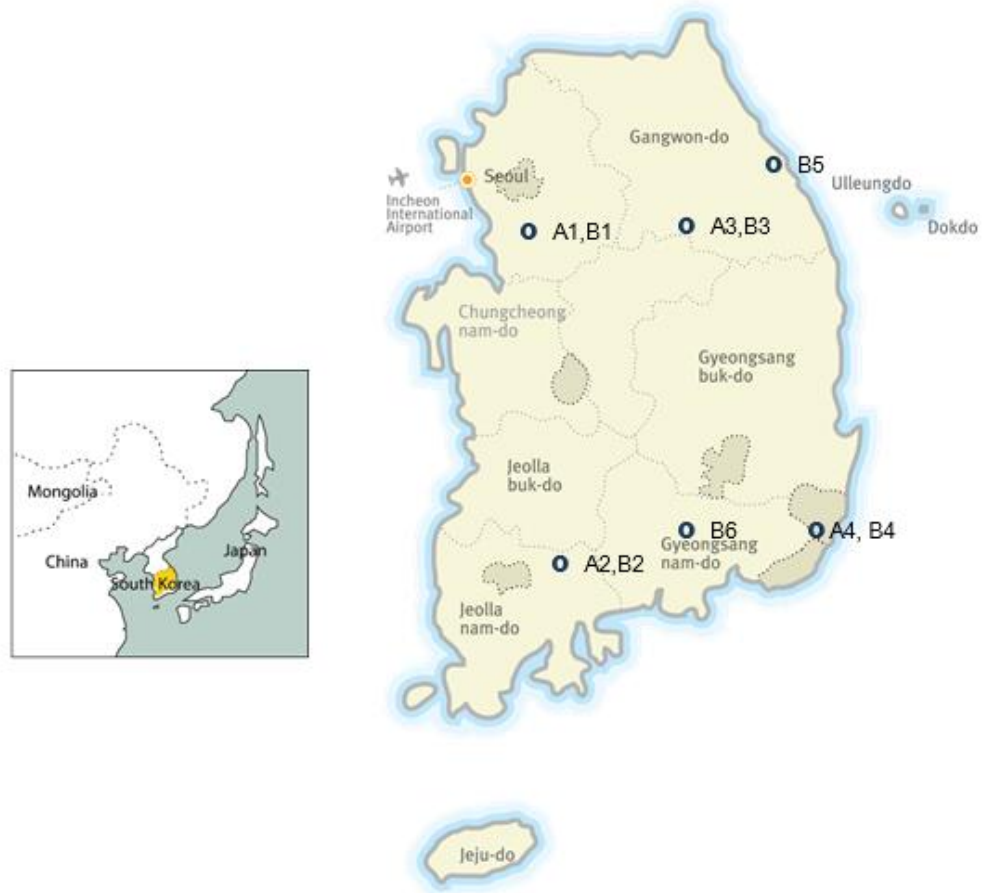

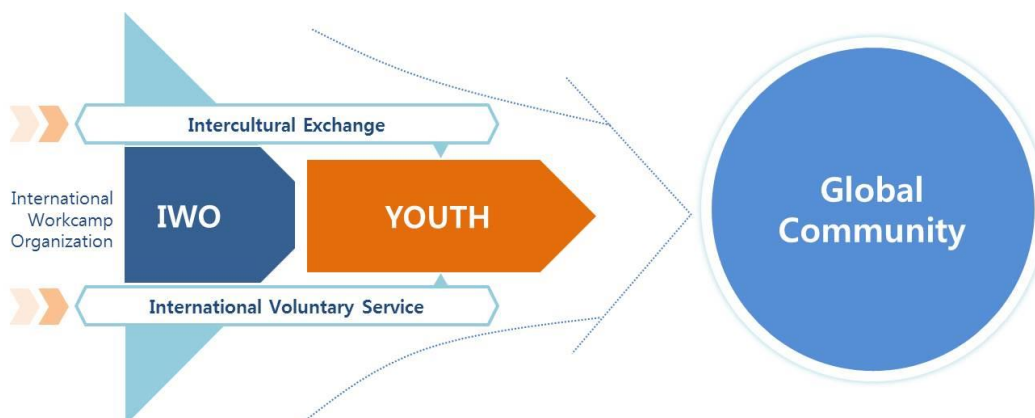

1. Introduction about IWO

IWO is a non-profit and non-governmental organization established in 1999 to promote world peace, global citizenship, youth and community development and cultural exchange through international voluntary service. We are an Executive committee member of CCIVS (Coordinating Committee for International Voluntary Service) at UNESCO, Paris, a member of NVDA (Network for Voluntary Development in Asia) and a member of Alliance (Alliance of European voluntary service organizations).

1.1 Our Vision

IWO dreams for youth to make contribution to the Global community through international voluntary service and intercultural exchange.



We believe that we can promote world peace by contributing to mutual respect and capacity for peaceful coexistence among all countries. We offer youth of all countries the opportunities with international voluntary service projects to understand cultural differences and diversity of each society. We believe that youth is our bright future in this world.

1.2 Our Activities

Our International Voluntary Service Projects offer young people the opportunity to participate in community-based projects in over 70 countries worldwide. The projects differ enormously ranging from nature conservation, restoration, education and construction to projects that are more socially based including work with adults and children with

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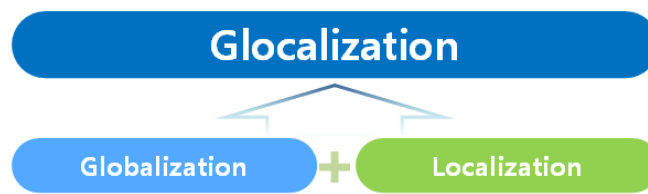
special needs, teaching or organizing youth/children's holiday schemes. Our main activities include.

- Learning and understanding diverse culture

1.3 Our Aims

The main purpose of IWO STV and LOVE projects is the so-called 'Glocalization' which is to bring the world to the country and get country opened to the world. Hence, the projects may enhance the cultural interchange between the local resident and international volunteers and also positively influence the host organization and local community by actively fulfilling the missions of each project.



- To let local people understand other countries and cultures by building the friendship with volunteers.
- To help international volunteers understand Korean culture and learn to respect the differences.
- To empower local people, support civil associations and non-governmental organizations.
- To encourage volunteers to have an active attitude toward responsibility for the environment, youth and society.
- To promote voluntary service activities in cooperation with local communities and NGOs.

2. General conditions of projects

All projects cooperate with local NGOs, government, civil society and local volunteers. The locals are pleased to host international volunteers who have different cultural, social and educational background because all are warm and open minded people.

2.1 STV : Short Term Volunteer Projects (Workcamps)

1) Number of Volunteers & Duration

- IWO hosts 12-15 volunteers on each workcamp. Each project will have 4-6 Koreans (Including 2 national camp leaders) and 7-10 international volunteers. It can be changed depending on the each project.

- Duration of the project is about 2 weeks.

2) Project Coordinator

- Each project has 2 camp leaders who are trained by IWO. They are also volunteers that prepare the project with IWO. They will coordinate the group to achieve the goals of each project.

3) Accommodation & Food

- Meals and accommodation are provided during the project by the host organization. Volunteers may cook by themselves or be served by the host organization.

- Participants are responsible for keeping the accommodation as clean during the project.

4) Free Time

- Participants are responsible for organizing their own free time with camp leaders during holiday. Host organization will advise volunteer for the information of local attractions.

5) Insurance

- IWO provides insurance for **accidents** only during the project (No dental clinic, illness, 3rd party's liability compensation). It covers only a percentage of the cost (co-pay) at maximum 40% according to the insurance regulation for foreigners in KOREA. Therefore, **Participants MUST bring their own insurance for health, travel and the 3rd party's liability compensation.**

6) Transportation

- Korea has convenient public transportation network over the country; therefore, all participants are advised to arrive at **Incheon International Airport** regardless of their project site. By taking a subway and an airport bus, participants can conveniently arrive from the airport to Seoul. There are many convenient public transportation systems from Seoul to each project sites.

7) Participation fee

- There is **No participation fee** on STV (Korea workcamp).

8) General Qualifications

- All volunteers are required to speak English.
- Participants should be motivated and be **Open-minded to the Asia and local culture** such as manners and foods.
- Generally, participants between age 18 and 40 can be accepted except teenager workcamp(14~17 years old).
- * **Over 35 years old**, sending organization has to counsel with IWO before sending an application.
- Volunteers should be aware of this is **NOT vacation trip** neither **cheap travel**.
- The illegal drugs is not allowed in Korea.

2.2 LOVE: LOng Term Volunteer Experience (MTV)

1) Number of Volunteers & Duration

- IWO generally hosts 2 volunteers on each project.
- Duration of the project is about 3 months.

2) Project Coordinator

- There is a staff who coordinate the program between the host organization, IWO and volunteers.
- During the project, volunteer's activities will be designated by the host organization.

3) Accommodation & Food

- Meals and accommodation will be provided during the project by host organization. However, depending on the project, volunteers may be also required to cook for themselves.

4) Free Time

- Work hours and schedules vary from project to project, but in general working hour is around 5 to 7 hours per day, Monday to Friday. Additionally, you may be asked to join certain activities on weekend if necessary.
- Volunteers are responsible for organizing their own free time after their daily work and for the weekend. If needed, host organizations will help volunteers to find necessary information on travel.

5) Orientation

- Orientation for participants is held for 2-3 days before the projects in Seoul

- At the orientation meeting, IWO will train volunteers on issues such as conflict resolution, project management, and provide detailed information about the project where they will be hosted. And they also get to know Korean culture and basic Korean to live in the local community.

6) Visa

- IWO will provide the invitation letter on request, once the applicant is accepted. However, we recommend that applicants also prepare the necessary documents to obtain VISA for themselves.

* Notice: NO VISA required to people from European Union within 90 days staying in Korea (Exceptions; Portugal-60days, Cyprus-30days) Please check with the Korean embassy in your country concerning the visa regulation for entering Korea.

7) Insurance

- IWO provides insurance for **accidents** only during the project (No dental clinic, illness, 3rd party's liability compensation). It covers only a percentage of the cost (co-pay) at maximum 40% according to the insurance regulation for foreigners in KOREA. Therefore, **Participants MUST bring their own insurance for health, travel and the 3rd party's liability compensation.**

8) Participation Fee

- It is 200 EURO and pay on arrival. It covers expenses of the orientation and mid-term evaluation during the project.

9) General Qualifications

- Participants aged from 18 to 40 years are acceptable. Exceptions may be negotiated.

- All participants are required to speak English to communicate and carry out a success of the activities. In the mean time, if volunteers try to speak Korea, it will be more welcomed by the local people.

- No illegal drugs in Korea.

- Participants should be motivated to complete the project successfully and have open mind to Korea and to local cultures.

4.2 STV (Workcamp) Project Description

IWO-71	Maze Market	BUSAN	18 JUL – 27 JUL	SOCI	15 vols
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This project is held by Geumjeonggu office of Busan city. With them, the Seodong where is a place aiming at energizing local traditional market and mingling daily life with art will have activities to make the market being alive through international volunteers. Seodong has historical significance itself. After breaking the Korean-war, many refugees moved to the Busan located in Southern part of Korea. Especially, Korean government forced the refugees move to the Seodong area, and it remains still very congested one.

Geumjeonggu want to dynamize this unstructured village and local-friendly art space with various programs including global citizenship education and related to cultural and artistic activities to the local children and residents through various ways of activities. Although Busan is the second biggest city in Korea, compared to the capital city, opportunities to take a chance to get global citizenship education and cultural experience program are still not common. Through those programs and events, residents in Seodong village will consider more familiar and specialize their village as global one.

Work: Participants will operate global citizenship education to local children through cultural exchange program. And also participants will do some manual work in the traditional market to give more active atmosphere of them.

Accommodation and food: In the university dormitory / Meals are provided

Leisure Activities: Visiting famous place in Busan

Location and Terminal: Geumjeonggu, Busan / Busan bus terminal

Requirements: Volunteers are requested to have an interest of local society and youth.

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Busan(<http://goo.gl/68Kk8p>) is the 2nd biggest city and the largest port city in Korea and it's about 400km away to south. The more Busan is developed, the more the environment concern increases. This project is organized in cooperation with "Local agenda 21 for Busan" which is association of various environment NGOs in Busan. This organization would like to renovate the rural area in Busan. So, participants will have various activities to solve the local issue and environment in Busan.

Work: Participants will help local people to clean a village, do a gardening and mural painting for the village renovation. And also participants will renovate the small village park for local elderly.

Accommodation and food: Guest house in the local community / Self-catering within a group

Location and Terminal: Busan / Busan train station

Leisure Activities: Visiting famous place in Busan

Chuncheon(<http://goo.gl/maps/ovG5r>) is about 80km away from Seoul and very calm and beautiful city by mountains and lakes around. This camp is held in cooperation with Gangwon MyongJin Blind School (between 8-15 years old). Especially the school educates and trains for the blind young students to be self-confident by having their own specialty. The school is pleased to provide them opportunities to be exposed to international atmosphere through the project.

Work: Participants will run the class to introduce their cultures and countries to students. Participants should be creative and adapt to teach them and communicate because of students are not able to see. Therefore, participants are required to bring interesting, educational ideas and materials to prepare the project. Participants will play an important role to encourage and give confidence to the blind students.

Accommodation and Food: In the School dormitory / Meals are provided

Location and Terminal: Chuncheon, Gangwondo / Chuncheon train station

Leisure Activities: Riding a bicycle along a river in Chuncheon

Remark: Highly motivated to take care of **blind young students** and their personal development

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Jecheon(<http://goo.gl/LI67Ca>) is about 200 km away from Seoul and famous with beautiful mountains around. There are a few social issues in Jecheon regarding of empowering youth, caring disabled people and dealing with the aging society. Host organization had been worked in long time to solve this. Therefore, Participants will take part in two projects for 'youth and a local elder' during a project. Participants will join in the youth camp which is to develop the global competencies of local youth by bringing a dynamic international culture and programmes. Participant will also help physically and economically disadvantaged local elders by making better living condition. In addition, there will be cultural exchange with local people.

Work: As an assistant of youth camp, participants will organize and run the activities related with their own cultures such as languages, traditional dance and games, song and so on. Participants will also do mural painting to decorate a local village and maintain houses and facilities for the elder who are disadvantaged physically and economically.

Accommodation and food: In the community center / Self-catering within a group

Leisure Activities: Visiting historic place in Jecheon.

Location and Terminal: Jecheon, Chungcheongbukdo / Jecheon Bus Terminal

Requirements: Requested to have an interest of local society and youth.

Wando(<http://goo.gl/maps/egPVP>) is an island which is about 500km away from Seoul to south. There is a bridge to mainland so that people can commute conveniently by transportation. And also Wando is famous with seafood and beautiful landscape. However, there are youth depopulation issues because many of youth move to the bigger city nearby for better education condition these days. In result, international exchange and experience is rare to these local children as well.

Therefore, this project focuses on providing new experience to local youth & children through international volunteers such as diverse cultures and education programs in cooperation with the host organization. The host organization is the local children center which is providing social and educational service for children and youth in Wando.

Work: Participants will organize Global cultural camp. There will be 20-30 local children in a camp who doesn't speak English very well. Participants will develop the whole programmes with indoor and outdoor activities such as traditional cultures, sports, choir, drawing, learning workshop and so on. It could be interesting experience to design youth programmes with international participants. It requires creative ideas and full of energy to get local young people exposed to new experiences.

Accommodation and Food: In the local children center / Meals are provided and self-catering.

Location and Terminal: Wando, Jeollanamdo / Wando bus terminal

Leisure activities: Visiting a beach for swimming and famous tourist sites around.

Yeongwol(<http://goo.gl/maps/s99ln>) is the most clean and nature-oriented province in Korea. It is about 180km away from Seoul to east bound. However, it is a bit isolated thanks to mountains and rivers around. Therefore, young people have rare opportunities to experience different cultures from outside and abroad. This project is held in cooperation with the Yeongwol Youth Centre which has various indoor and outdoor facilities.

Work: Participants will organize the youth camp for the local youth summer camp. The sessions in the projects are quite open to participants although there will be various and exciting activities in the river, mountains and play ground. Therefore, participants are required to bring any ideas and activities to make the programs together. The project site has various equipment and facilities related with **outdoor and indoor** such as music instrument and sports. Participants are required to like to interaction with youth.

Accommodation and Food: In the youth center / Meals are provided and Self-catering

Location and Terminal: Yeongwol, Gangwondo / Yeongwol bus terminal

Leisure Activities: Visiting historical places and exploring caves around

Remark: Interest in outdoor activities, Materials to show your culture

Yeongwol(<http://goo.gl/maps/z6Yw>) is the most clean and nature-oriented province in Korea. It is about 200km away from Seoul to the east bound. This project is held in cooperation with the Local Children care center in Yeongwol. Yeongwol has very easy access from Seoul by express bus so that it takes about 2 hours. The project site is safe and well equipped for the activities and staying.

Work: There are two main activities during a project. In first, the participants will become a group teacher to introduce their traditional culture with 20~30 local youth during the project. Participants will have various intercultural activities among themselves with their own ideas. Any kind of activities and ideas from participants are very welcome such as traditional cultures, sports, play, choir, drawing, learning workshop and so on. In second, participants do voluntary service with a theme of environment conservation in a local village.

Accommodation and Food: In the local children center / Meals are provided

Location and Terminal: Yeongwol, Gangwondo / Jecheon bus terminal

Leisure activities: Doing a hike the mountain and swim also visit historical places around

Namhansanseong was designed as an emergency capital for the Joseon dynasty (1392–1910), in a mountainous site 25 km south-east of Seoul. Built and defended by Buddhist monk-soldiers, it could accommodate 4,000 people and fulfilled important administrative and military functions. It is the only fortress that has been used as an emergency palace during a war so it is historically significant. In recognition of its value, Namhansanseong was designated as a UNESCO World Heritage site in 2013. But, so far it is more famous for a mountain-climbing and driving destination for local residents and visitors. Besides, many people have no idea it is World Heritage site. The aim of this project is promoting the importance and value of Namhansanseong as a World Heritage and preserving it.

Work: Participants will organize the global culture camp for youth not only to give them awareness of world heritage site and know more about the importance of world heritage but also to teach how the other country treat the world heritage.

Accommodation and food: Guest house near the youth centre / Meals are provided.

Location and Terminal: Seongnam, Gyeonggi-do / Seongnam bus terminal

Leisure Activities: Visiting Seoul which is the capital of Korea in free time.

Project: Historically, and even now, human beings have been searching for the true definition of a peaceful, harmonious, and “happy life”. In pursuit of the answer to this question, a group of people gathered in 1984 in what is now Sanan Village, an idealistic community which follows the philosophy of an environment-friendly, non-possessive society. As of today, around 20 people reside within this communal village, and the residents are encouraged to pay more attention to the preservation and conservation of the environment while also freely sharing public resources. People in the village live together, work together and share together. The volunteer also need to follow their life style. Main income of the village is chicken farming. Those who are interested in a new and alternative way of living which is very different from a “normal and capitalized” life in Korea, may obtain some fresh ideas about their life through this program.

Work

- Poultry farming for example, feeding chickens, collecting eggs every morning, working in the egg-selection-facility.
- Sometimes required to help farming and housework

Extra activities: You may take some chances to participate in weekend workcamp

Qualifications of Volunteers

- 1) **Essential qualification** - No allergy to chicken and nuts
- 2) **Preferred qualification** - Open mind to learn from villagers and work

Documents to be submitted: VEF

Location: Hwaseong City, GyeongGi Province, Taking 1.5 hour from Seoul by bus.

Historical site around Hwaseong city and close to Seoul

Terminal: Incheon International Airport

Project: Alternative school is an educational establishment with a curriculum and methods that are nontraditional. These schools have a special curriculum offering a more flexible program of study than a formal school. A wide range of philosophies and teaching methods are offered by alternative schools; some have strong political, scholarly, or philosophical orientations, and dissatisfied with some aspects of mainstream or [formal education](#).

Green Dream is especially focusing on eco-farming education, independency, peace and community- based education. Therefore, school expects international volunteers who can bring creative teaching method not formal, deliver the information of various countries, cultures and languages and build a friendship with students. It will be very unique experiences to volunteers who are interested in sharing with your personal background/knowledge and learning unique education system.

Work

- Teaching English to students
- Participating classes with students: Pottery class, arts etc.
- Joining outdoor activities with students: hiking and field trip
- Teaching English in local children center near the school once a week

Teaching Information:

- Age & Number of students: 17 to 19 years old & 10 to 20 students at a school
- Number of teachers: 1 English teacher (A main communicator with foreign volunteers)

Extra activities: The school may invite you to join them on field trips, such as hiking, cycling

Project: Local Children Center in Korea is the facility for the children welfare services. The center provides children a shelter after the regular school and educational/cultural opportunities as well. Most of children in rural area have fewer opportunities to meet foreigners and get a high quality English education compared to the urban area. Also although international marriage is quite common phenomenon in rural area, local residents are lack of understanding of multi-culture. So the children are facing discrimination in the school, cultural and linguistic difficulties. International volunteers can give them chances to interact with foreigners and to understand multi-culture. And English can be a tool to understand Korean local children and interact with them. Big Tree Local Children Center welcomes you to check your own class with your talents and ideas.

Work:

- Teaching English to primary school students and middle school students
- Helping farming
- Taking care of children while they are in the center

Teaching Information:

- Age & Number of students: 8 to 16 years old & 10 to 30 children at an LCC
- Number of Teachers: 1 to 3 teachers

Extra activities: The center may invite you to join with them on field trips on Saturday

Qualifications of Volunteers:

1) Essential qualification

- Those who have teaching experience or are interested in teaching. (Especially with non-formal methods)
- Those who are interested in kids and socialized with them.

2) Preferred qualification - Interest in outdoor activities and farming

Location: Yeongwol, Gangwon province. Taking 5 hours from Seoul by bus. The center is quite distance from the downtown however, volunteers can use the shuttle bus from center to downtown or bicycle.

Many tourists visit Yeongwol to enjoy the nature and activities in there.
